
The last day of term is Friday 4th April and school will finish at 1.30pm



our Mummy's do for us. Thank you Mummy, we love you.


#### Physical Development

#### Our Learning

#### Communication and Language

This week we have completed Spring 2 of Little Wandle. We have focused on longer words, using the chunking technique to read words such as "carpark" and "rooftop". We have also looked at plurals and occasions where the letter 's' is read as a 'z' sound—such as torches and fizzes. We will be undertaking assessments this week to see if there are any areas which we need to revisit.

Please continue to practice tricky words with your child, including:

He, she, we, be, me, my, by, put, pull, sure, pure and all.

#### Maths

This week in maths, we had some fantastic opportunities for Oracy! We played a game of 'snap' with doubles—children had to explain if two cards showing the same numbers represented in different ways were a double or not. It was wonderful to hear the children explaining their mathematical thinking to their partners!


#### Our Learning

#### This week:

In math this week, we continued our unit on place value within 50. The children have learnt how to partition a number up to 50 into tens and ones. They have become more confident in using a place value grid and base 10 resources to help support their understanding of partitioning.

In English this week, we spent time learning about when to use an exclamation mark in a sentence. The children spent time writing a letter to the mermaid warning her that Lanky Len and Hefty Hugh want to cut her hair. The children managed to such fantastic adjectives in their writing and are starting to use the suffixes 'er' and 'est' to compare different objects.

In afternoon sessions this week, we started our DT unit on making Easter cards with levers. The children spent time researching different cards and spent time discussing the different materials and decorations they would need to make their card. On Thursday, the children enjoyed designing their own Easter egg ready for card making next week.





#### <u>Our Learning</u>

This week in English, we have worked hard to finish writing our stories based on: The Queen's Hat. We have focused on our spellings and presenting our work beautifully, showing off our best handwriting!

#### Our Learning

This week, we have continued to study light with a focus on being safe in the sun and the importance of using sun cream. In Computing lessons, we learnt more about branching databases and created one of our own.

In Maths, we have been exploring the measurement of weight and enjoyed taking part on a practical lesson using weighing scales. It would be great if the children could apply this at home by helping with the weighing out of ingredients when preparing meals or looking at the weight of food items when you go shopping.

In English, we planned and began to write a poem independently entitled 'The Colour Collector'.

#### Our Learning

This week in English, the children have been learning about the human rights for refugees. They read the text and wrote about how effective they thought the text was. Then the children have been taking part in a debate about whether they should stand up for their class mates or leave it for them to deal with on their own.

#### Our Learning

This week, we completed our coding unit in ICT. Here we used Microbits to explore algorithms and made name badges using LED displays.

In maths, we focused on drawing graphs and interpreted information provided to us. We also deepened our mathematical skills by learning new strategies to interpret two-way tables.

In English, we continued to explore 1001 Arabian Nights through drama and retellings. We compared traditional tales, like Cinderella, to the adaptations in this text.

This term in PSHRE, we have focused on how to keep our bodies and minds healthy.

#### Our Learning

This week, in art, we finished our art unit on Frida Kahlo by creating a surrealist self-portrait to represent our inner and outer self, using the skills we have learned during this topic.

In English, we were introduced to a new character and wrote a short narrative piece from her perspective.

In maths, we completed the current topic of shapes, and explored circles, co-ordinates and translation.

**Next week**, in **DT**, we will start our new topic on bridges! We will explore bridges around the world (including some that move!) and looking at how the different parts of a bridge work together to keep it stable.

In English, we will extend the narrative of the story by writing our own fiction piece. We will then continue to read The Last Wild as a class reader.

In maths, we will focus on the last few topics on reflection, statistics and scaling.

PSHRE Focus: Healthy Me. In PSHRE this term, we will learn how to take responsibility for our wellbeing. We will know about different types of drugs and how they affect the human body — particularly the liver and the heart. I will understand that some people can be exploited and made to do things that are against the law. I will know why some people join gangs and the risks this involves . I understand what it means to be emotionally well and can explore people's attitudes towards mental health/illness.





#### Spotlight on Psychology Services

#### Gary Nixon Educational Psychologist

Gary is an outstanding leader in education, health and children's services environments and is the Principal Educational and Child Psychologist here in Slough. He has previously held senior leadership positions in Shire, City and London Borough Areas and is a respected school leader, holding positions across all areas of SEND and learning, with specialist expertise in applied psychology, educational and organizational leadership and school improvement.

Within his professional life, Gary continues to influence national policy developments and is very passionate about the offer provided to our SEND young people, who are the heart of what we do as a service and why we do what we do.

All Educational Psychology work relates to the key themes of the SEND Code of Practice, including assessment of children and young people, which recognises the unique nature of every child and their unique individual circumstance. The Psychology Team, work with young people and their families to draw information together to develop a formulation of their strengths, needs and aspirations.

With this information Gary works to find the right approach to interventions and the support that would be helpful and beneficial going forward. This includes preparation of psychological advice to the authority as part of Education Health Care (EHC) needs assessments and supporting the council to understand needs and provision if a change of placement



or provision is requested or required. Our SEND young people deserve an inclusive service, where their needs are recognised, understood and form part of what we put in place to help them succeed in education.

Slough's Childrens Disability
Register is an online register which
captures information about
children and young people, aged 025 years, with disabilities or special
educational needs in Slough. The
information that you give us will be
used anonymously to show the use
of and demand for services in Slough.

On registering your child's details, you will be given the option to receive a Max Card.

The Max Card is a national, local authority-commissioned discount initiative for looked after children and children with additional needs aged 0-25 years. The scheme enables families to visit hundreds of attractions across the UK at a free or discounted rate.

 Check mymaxcard.co.uk/venues/ for details and a list of venues.

In Slough, your child might be eligible for a Max Card if they:

- · have an EHC plan
- · receive DLA
- have a letter of diagnosis of substantial and long-term mental impairment from CAMHS
- have medical proof of a physical impairment that has a long-term effect on ability to do normal daily activities.

This register is for Slough Borough Council residents only.

Registration on Slough Children's Disability Register is not a requirement to obtain any services in Slough and equally does not constitute automatic entitlement to any services.

#### **SEND Area Inspection update**

As our previous newsletters have highlighted, we are preparing for our local area inspection of the services and provision for our children and young people with SEND. We are currently in the process of refining our area strengths, and areas for further development.

We have significant strengths in our Early Years Education sector, our Children's Centres (who were recently inspected by Ofsted and rated Good and Outstanding!) and in the performance of our schools and colleges across the borough. We are keen to further improve the consistency of communication and the timeliness of our assessments across SEND and the Health Teams, working closely with partners such as Special Voices, schools, and other professionals.

We are a service committed to positive change, which won't happen overnight, but we are confident that the improvements will benefit our SEND young people and families, who deserve a better service. There is also a dedicated page on Slough Borough Council's website that relates to Ofsted's initial report on SEND and our written statement of action, which highlights the areas identified for improvement.
