With the changes in weather we will be wearing coats more. We have been practising to put on our coats by ourselves. Please encourage your children to do their own zips and fastenings up.





Our Learning

This Week:

In math, we have been practicing doubling numbers within 10, and the children have become very efficient at recalling them! We have also learned how to find 1 more and 1 less than a number. The children have used a range of mathematical resources to support their learning, including cubes, counting bears, and tens frames.

In English, the children have been exploring a poem all about windy weather. They have enjoyed looking at the illustrations in the book and discussing how the wind has made different characters feel. On Thursday, the children had a go at making their own wind spinners to use outside in the windy weather!

Busy Learning:

This week, the children have completed a range of learning opportunities (set tasks) in the busy learning area. They have been representing numbers using cubes, drawing and labeling pictures of their families, and spotting digraphs in familiar words. They have also really enjoyed playing with the new water equipment and have demonstrated fantastic teamwork when filling up the buckets! Great team work was also demonstrated when the children built a tower so tall it was nearly double the size of Miss Moore and Miss Rowe!

We are nearly finished setting up Seesaw, so keep an eye out for our first post!

Next Week's Learning:

Math: We will be comparing numbers using language such as "fewer," "more," "bigger," and "smaller." English: We will be starting our new class text, Tree: Seasons Come, Seasons Go. The children will be retelling the story.

Science: We will begin our new science topic on the seasons, which will align with our class text.

Our Learning



This week, the children have been learning about the features of instructions, such as time conjunctions and bossy verbs! They followed a set of instructions to create hedgehog artwork and then




wrote their own set of instructions to Samuel Pepys' maid in English.

The children are becoming more confident in the place value of two-digit numbers and also enjoyed starting our new science topic this week by observing and sorting different objects, identifying what material they were made from and describing their properties.

Our Learning

This week, we continued to use the book 'Stone Age Boy' to inspire our writing. We focussed on writing sentences using time adverbials, similes and onomatopoeia. In Maths, we continued to explore numbers to 1000. In our afternoon lessons, we began a Science topic with a focus of rocks. We looked at different types of rocks and how they are formed.

Next week, we will be taking part in an online lesson, led by the author of 'How To Train Your Dragon-Cressida Cowell— as part of the Henley Literary Festival. We will also be planning a piece of independent writing inspired by the work we have been doing in English lessons so far. In Maths, we will be working on addition and subtraction strategies. Our Science lessons will allow the children to further explore rocks and soil. This will include the opportunity to dig for 'fossils' in the Y3 outdoor area—as long as the weather allows!

Our Learning

This week, we completed our history unit on the Roman invasion and settlement of Britain. We researched the influence the Romans had and created an information page.

In maths, we compared and ordered numbers up to 10,000 and we thought about how we know a number has a bigger or smaller value.

In English, we planned and wrote our own diary entry, from the perspective of a Roman slave or gladiator. We had the chance to share them with our peers.

Next week, we will understand what happens to different states of matter when they are heated and learn the different processes when matters change their state.

In maths, we will learn the skills to round 4-digit numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000.

In English, we will begin our new book Charlotte's Web by E.B White. We will make predictions using the front cover and explore settings

PSHRE Focus: Being Me in My World. In PSHRE this term, we will learn that our attitudes and actions make a difference to our class team. We will acknowledge who is in our school community, the roles they play and how we fit in. We will understand that our actions affect ourselves and others. 

Y6 Geography



Our Learning

This week, in geography, we learnt how to read maps using 4 and 6 grid references. We had the opportunity to apply our skills to an orienteering activity around the school grounds.

In English, we had the chance to write our own character description of a magical teacher and a magical beast, using our knowledge of the story..

In maths, we started a new topic on addition and subtraction focusing on common factors and common multiples. Furthermore, we explored the Divisibility Rules.

Next week, in DT, we will begin planning and designing our own magic wands inspired by Harry Potter, choosing which magical materials we will make them out of. Then we can use our creations on Hogwarts Day!

In English, we will continue on Harry's journey and will have the chance to learn more about Quidditch and other fantastic beasts by writing an explanation text.

In maths, we will continue to explore the current topic by improving our knowledge of prime, square and cube numbers followed by multiplication by a 2-digit number.
