They spoke so proudly about their school, representing Priory wonderfully.

Thank you to parents who took part in the survey; your comments were deeply appreciated. The inspectors read aloud some of the positive free-text responses during our feedback meeting, and they were so heartfelt that even the lead inspector became emotional.

I'd also like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to our staff, who worked tirelessly to showcase the very best of our school.

Their efforts ensured the inspectors gained a true sense of the dedication and incredible work that goes into supporting our pupils every single day.

We understand many of you are eager to hear the outcome of the inspection. While we are unable to share details until the report is finalised, I expect to receive it within 18 days for fact-checking, and we will aim to share it with you within 30 days. As soon as it becomes available, we will ensure you have access to it. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Our focus text this week has been the traditional tale Hansel and Gretel. This was a new story to many of the children, and they really enjoyed learning all about the witch in the sweetie house!



We took full advantage of the frosty weather this week, and the children absolutely loved exploring ice outside. We had an arctic themed tray, where the children could see penguins and seals frozen inside the ice. The mud kitchen was full of lovely icy treats, and the children were fascinated by the different things that had frozen.

Maths

In Maths this week, we thoroughly enjoyed reading *Pete the Cat and his Four Groovy Buttons*. We have been investigating different arrangements of the number 4 (2 and 2, 3 and 1) and provided plenty of opportunities for the children to develop their subitising. We also reflected on last week's learning-circles and triangles—and completed some engaging activities during provision to see what information the children had remembered.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

This week our circle time was all about what makes us special. We learned about the word 'unique' and shared something special about ourselves. We asked each child to choose one leaf from the field, and then we looked at how unique and special each leaf was.

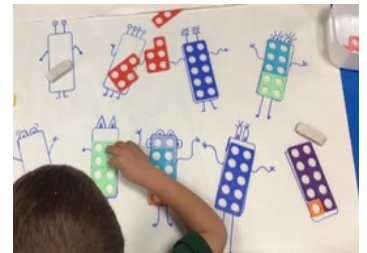


Our Learning

This Week:

The children have been learning all about addition! They explored part-whole models and tens frames to solve simple number sentences. They also practiced writing their own addition sentences, focusing on numbers within 10.

During busy learning time, the children had lots of fun practicing their number bonds to 10, building on last week's lessons. It's wonderful to see how much quicker they're getting at recalling them!



Our writing focus this week was on fireworks. The children created their own poems, using a range of exciting adjectives to describe the colorful displays. They have shown tremendous determination as we worked on the tricky skill of writing on the line. Although challenging, their improvement this week has been fantastic! Well done, everyone!

In our afternoon sessions, we began our new science unit on materials. The children had so much fun organising various objects by their material and starting to explore their different properties. In busy learning, the children were given the opportunity to paint on different materials; they have produced some lovely pieces of artwork.

English- We will be starting our new class text: Jesus' Christmas party.

Math - We will be focusing on subtracting numbers within 10.

Science - Children will be further exploring a range of materials and their properties.

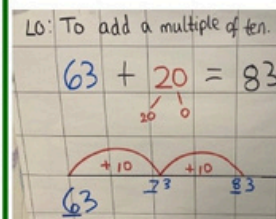

Our Learning

This week, in English we have finished writing up our fact files on African animals and look forward to assembling our final piece next week. We also read the first part of our new book: Anna Hibiscus on Holiday, by Atinuke.

In maths we have worked hard on using blank number lines to add single-digit numbers and also add multiples of 10 to any 2-digit number.



In Geography, we have enjoyed learning about aerial maps, grids maps, atlases and street maps



In Computing, we are learning about digital photography and this week we focused on how to take a good photograph – thinking about positioning and framing as well as portrait versus landscape.



Next week, we will continue to read our book in English, about a little girl called Anna who goes on holiday. We will then write a postcard to our cousins, in role as Anna, asking them to come and join us. In maths, we will consolidate our understanding from this week and move on to add teen numbers. We will also be covering the different formal elements of art in some of our afternoon lessons, focusing in particular on texture and pattern.

Our Learning

In English, the children have been continuing to read Charlotte's Web. They made excellent newspaper broadcasts that they shared with the class about the events at the County Fair.

In the afternoons, we have been continuing to think about the difference between farming in Italy and The UK. They have also been learning about how food travels from around the world for us to eat and how it is better for the planet if we eat more food that is sourced locally.

Next week, is an exciting week because 4 Chamberlain will be going to the farm and the children are going to be tasting, designing and making pizza.

In maths, we will be continuing to learn our times tables and focusing on our seven times table.

In English, we will be starting our new topic–Feast. We will also be sharing photos in next week's edition of the children's trip to the farm.

PSHRE Focus: Being Me in My World. In PSHRE this term, we will learn that our attitudes and actions make a difference to our class team. We will acknowledge who is in our school community, the roles they play and how we fit in. We will understand that our actions affect ourselves and others. We will learn to care about other people's feelings by trying to empathise with them.

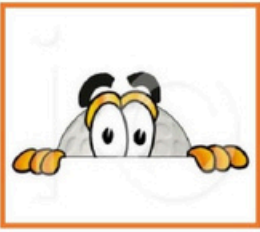

Our Learning

This week, we continued to explore the migration routes of refugees and began our learning on mountains, earthquakes and volcanoes.

In maths, we learnt about square numbers and cube numbers alongside how to multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000.

In English, we began our unit on Azzi. This is a picture book which explores the impact of WW2 on our world and the journey of a refugee family as they search for safety.

In PSHRE, we continued to look at cultural differences within the classroom and how we should be celebrating these differences rather than allowing them to cause conflict.

Next week, we will continue exploring Vector Drawings in ICT and Mountains, Earthquakes and Volcanoes in geography.

In maths, we will start our fractions topic and focus on finding equivalent fractions for non unit and unit fractions.

In English, we will continue writing effective sentences for our speech. We will use our knowledge of refugees to help structure thoughts and ideas about refugeeism.

We took part in an interactive musical show and hands-on workshop.

In English, we planned and write our own biography on an inspirational figure in the Black community, including the likes of Harold Moody, Mary Seacole and Walter Tull.

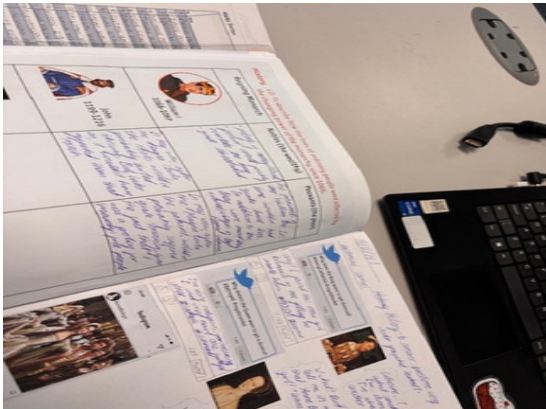
In maths, we continued to explore fractions, focusing on adding and subtracting mixed numbers and solving multi-step problems.

In Art, the children have looked at Helga Stentzel's food art and enjoyed creating faces then eating their art.

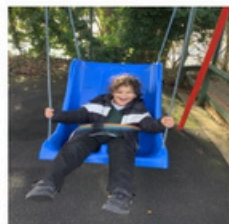
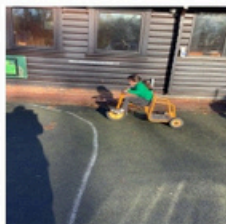

What the Woodlands has been up to

This week:

In English,
