

Our Learning

This week:

In math, we have continued our unit on place value to 20. The children have been focusing on the numbers 15, 16 and 17. They have been using base 10 to partition numbers into tens and ones, looking for patterns as a number increases. We have been practicing finding 1 more and 1 less of number, as well as, quickly recalling doubles.

In English this week, the children wrote perfect sentences to retell the story of Lost and Found. The children discussed how the penguin felt about being away from home and had a go at using new adjectives such as: isolated and secluded to up level the adjective 'lonely'.

In afternoon sessions this week, we continued with Geography unit about our local area. We had lots of fun comparing slough to the seaside town Bournemouth. The children discussed similarities and difference between the two places and then recalled their own experiences about when they had visited a seaside town.

Our Learning

This week in English, the children have written some wonderful descriptions of Funni. They included details about what she looks like, her personality and what she likes to do. In maths, we have been subtracting 2-digit numbers from 2-digit numbers and have also been applying our knowledge to solve word problems where we have had to find the difference between two amounts. In science, we went on a winter walk around the school grounds and observed the trees, plants, animals and weather. We discussed our findings and wrote up an account in our books. Here are some of our dreams and goals from PSHRE last week.









Next week, we will finish our subtraction unit by solving word problems and working on challenges. In English, we will be writing a setting description based on The Secret Sky Garden at different stages in the book. We have been focusing on using expanded noun phrases in our writing to add lots of detail. In science, we will be looking at the life cycle of a sunflower as well as crafting our own plants and labelling their different parts and functions.

Our Learning

This week, we have continued to learn more about rivers in our Geography lessons. We learnt how important rivers are to animals and humans and compared the Thames and the Nile. Next week, we will be taking part in some experience lessons to learn about the life of working Victorian children. In Maths, we will be exploring divisibility using our multiplication facts.

In History lessons, we will begin to look at life in Ancient Egypt. We will also be learning more about coding in Computing and continuing to practise the songs we are learning for our upcoming performance.

Our Learning

This week, the children have enjoyed finding out the parts that they have for our production of Finding Nemo. We are in full swing with the rehearsals and the children are enjoying learning the songs.

In English, we have continued to work on our book Beowulf, the children have been answering comprehension questions and writing a character description of Grendel.



In Science, we created a factfile about the history of astronomy



Our Learning

This week, we continued our Science topic focusing on Space. In particular, we looked at astronomers and discussed diversity within this area of science and history. We also became experts on the planets and on spherical bodies.

In maths, we started our new top of multiplication, where we explored new strategies to multiply 4 digits by 1 digit and 2 digits by 2 digits.

In English, we began to watch One Small Step- a story about a girl called Luna- and will eventually retell this narrative in our own words.

This term in PSHRE, we will be looking at Dreams and Goals. Here we will focus on the values of hope and trust.

Next week, we will continue to explore our solar system and focus on day, night and phases of the moon!

In maths, we will continue our topic of multiplication, where we will expand our learning by learning new strategies to multiply 3 digits by 2 digits, and 4 digits by 2 digits.

In English, we will be continuing to write effective sentences for our short film: One Small Step.

Our Learning

This week, in science, we learnt more about Darwin's discoveries and how he came up with the theory of evolution. We also conducted an investigation into Darwin's finches and how their beaks had evolved and adapted.

In English, we continued writing effective sentences for our poem. We had the chance to learn more about the Industrial Revolution and how it changed the world. In math, we focused on mastering the skills of adding, subtracting, and multiplying decimals by integers. Additionally, we revisited the concepts of multiplying and dividing by 10, 100, and 1,000.

Next week, in geography, we will start our new topic on the Americas! We will identify some of the countries and learn about the wide range of climates and biomes.

In English, we will draw on our knowledge of the Industrial Revolution to use in our poem. We will understand its impact on nature and animals — including the moth.

In maths, we will complete the topic of decimals by focusing on dividing decimals by integers and applying division and multiplication in context. We will then begin a new topic on ratios, exploring both language and symbols.

PSHRE Focus: Dreams and Goals. In PSHRE this term, we will understand the difference between realistic and unrealistic goal-setting. We will be able to identify our learning strengths and the steps we need to take to achieve our goals. We will share our dreams for the world by identifying problems and discussing our concerns with other people. We will understand how to work with others to help make the world a better place. Lastly, we will be able to recognise and celebrate our own achievements when our goals are met.


















Peek at the Week

What the Woodlands has been up to

This week:

In English,

This is also a great opportunity for families to share any photos of linked celebrations. Chinese New Year is marked on the 29th January and it is the year of the snake!





Why is my child worrying?

Worries/fears are normal.

Worries come and go.

Sometimes worries can grow over time and stop your child from doing something or going somewhere.

For example, they may make your child:

- Avoid going to a park where there may be dogs that frighten them
- Avoid going upstairs on their own at home
- Avoid speaking to new people
- Have sleep difficulties
- Feel less confident in themselves, thus unable to do their best or enjoy activities

Working together to create positive changes:

We can think of all behaviour as a form of communication. When we hold this in mind it's important we try to understand what drives behaviour. This can often be difficult for children and young people to express or identify themselves.

Through our interventions we will work together with you to help identify needs and emotions underlying the behaviour. This greater understanding offers the opportunity to explore helpful coping strategies to create positive changes over time.

Mental Health Support Team (MHST) supports children and young people with emerging, mild or moderate mental health difficulties which may be affecting day to day life.

The MHST is a new initiative and the service is being offered to 14 participating schools in Slough.

We offer selected schools:

- Interventions to support children with mild to moderate mental health difficulties
- Surgeries for staff
- Mental Health Network meetings
- Staff training and support schools to have more of a focus on emotional wellbeing and mental health
- Peer mentoring
- Online access to resources and peer support on emotional wellbeing and mental health for parents/carers and professionals via digital platforms called SHaRON

Depending on the age of the child or young person, we may work either directly with them or with their parents/carers. We also work with school staff supporting them to have a greater focus on emotional health and wellbeing in the various aspects of school life.

The team consists of:

- Team Lead
- Educational Mental Health Practitioners (EMHPs)
- Cognitive Behaviour Therapy (CBT) Therapist / Clinical Supervisor
- Clinical Psychologist / Senior Clinical Supervisor
- Administrator

Ways we can support you

- Managing fears and worries
- Separation anxiety
- Panic attacks
- Phobias eg: dogs, the dark
- Behavioural and sleep difficulties
- Problem solving

What to expect

After an initial assessment with both you and your child, we work collaboratively with you, the parent/carer, over 6-8 sessions.

These sessions may consist of:

- Learning about the cause and maintenance of anxiety/behavioural difficulties in children
- Setting and working towards goals that your child would like to achieve
- Developing techniques in sessions that you can use at home when supporting your child
