


Concert Congratulations


Orchard News

This week in maths, Plums and Apples have been sorting animal figures into big, bigger and biggest size groups. In Cherry class, the children have been colour sorting, using materials to add and subtract 1 from a group of objects and solve number problems.



In English, Apple and Plums class have been sorting and matching rhyming words. They used PECS to communicate what they could see in the book 'Rumble in the Jungle' and then wrote/copied CVC words.

Cherry class have been adding Nouns and Verbs in their sentences and focusing on capital letters, finger spaces and full stops to support their writing skills.
