## Playdough Disco—Lets Party!



This term the children in year 1 have been exploring playdough disco! The program is designed to strengthen fine motor skills and improvie their handwriting skills whilst having fun. Each session involves squeezing, rolling, pinching and pressing the dough in time to the music. The children have enjoyed each session and I have been stopped in the corridor many times by children asking when the next play dough disco session is taking place.

As these sessions seem so popular, I thought I would include the YouTube link and a simple play dough recipe for the children to enjoy during half term. ### Recipe for Playdough

- 2 cups of flour
- 1/2 cup of salt
- 1 cup of hot water (possibly a 1/2 cup more)
- 2 tablespoon of cooking oil
- 2 tablespoons of cream of tartar
- food colouring
- STEP 1. Combine all the dry ingredients in a bowl, and form a well in the centre.
- STEP 2. Add the cooking oil and food colouring to the dry ingredients.
- STEP 3. Add water and stir to form the playdough! Go ahead and knead your playdough until you reach your

**TIP:** If you notice that the playdough looks a little runny, you might be tempted to add more flour. Before you do this, allow the mixture to rest for a few moments! That will give the salt a chance to absorb the extra moisture. Feel your playdough before you add any additional flour! You likely won't need any but if your dough is sticky, add an additional 1/4 cup of flour at a time.
