Headteacher's News

This week at Priory

At the beginning of the week we had a practice fire alarm. The children are really beginning to understand the rules and expectations of a fire drill and I was very impressed with them. If you do discuss it with your child, please do reinforce that it is critically important that children walk in single file, silent lines and wait in their expected place silently. This is to ensure order and calm so that roll calls can be done quickly and effectively.

I had the pleasure of watching some of our Year 5 and 6 pupils dance at the Slough Sports Network Dance Festival. They performed so well and I was super proud of them as were their parents. I do want to say a very special thank you to Matt Thompson who choreographed the routine and dedicated his time to their rehearsals.

This week myself and the SLT are meeting with each class teacher to discuss class progress and attainment. We do this every term and it is very intense but a really good way of SLT keeping on top of all children's progress.

Parking Concerns

I am aware that at times the carpark gets a bit tricky, I am very aware that there are parents who park very inconsiderately, on the road and in the car park. We cannot deploy staff to the car park or the road anymore as we have a more streamlined workforce and have no available staff to man the carparks. This means that in order for everything to run as smoothly as possible and causes the least amount of stress, I need everyone to consider their driving and their parking choices.

In the event of a parking dispute, I urge all parties to approach the situation with civility and respect. There is never a justification for shouting or aggression, especially in the presence of children.

The impact of such behaviour on children is profound. Two recent testimonials illustrate the distress caused:

Child 1: "I thought he was going to hit me."

Child 2: "Everyone was shouting and it was very scary."

Let's commit to creating a safe and respectful environment for all, where conflicts are resolved peacefully and children feel secure."




