## **Orchard News**

This week in the Orchard, the children have continued exploring their topic for this term, Under the Sea! This term our topic book is Sharing a Shell (story can be found here: <u>https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aQ6SvbrEhvl</u>)

We would like to say a huge thank you to all the parents who were able to come and support their child during sports day. It was a lovely day and all the children had lots of fun!

Also we hope you all enjoyed visiting the orchard on the Thursday afternoon and taking part in some our learning activities.





This week during **English** the children have been identifying the verbs 'doing words' within the story such as 'swim, hide and scuttle', using colourful semantics. They have also been using colourful semantic sentence strips to create simple sentences to describe the actions of some of the characters. Using their phonics knowledge to spell and write the 'doing words' and continue developing their letter formations.







This week in **Maths** the children have continued to develop their knowledge of place value of ten and ones units as well as exploring hundredths by partitioning two and three digit numbers. The children have been using ten number frames to strengthen their one to one correspondence skills and number puzzles to support their knowledge of number sequencing.

## Summer Reading Challenge 2023 - Ready, Set, Read!



The Reading Agency has teamed up with the Youth Sport Trust for a challenge celebrating play and participation. This year's theme will encourage children to engage in reading, games and sport and keep their minds and bodies active over the summer.

Children aged 4 and over can complete the challenge by enjoying six books over the summer, collecting stickers and rewards along the way. Those that finish will be awarded a medal and certificate to mark their achievement. The challenge presents reading as a fun and enjoyable activity and encourages children to become lifelong book lovers. It helps prevent the trend for reading skills to dip over the summer holidays, and enhances and supports the school's reading initiatives. The fun rewards motivate the children to progress through the challenge and it is inclusive to children of all abilities as they can choose any library books that appeal to them to count towards the challenge.

Slough Libraries will be launching the challenge on Tuesday 4<sup>th</sup> July. It's free to take part -children just need to be library members. It's quick and easy to join.

The challenge will end on 16<sup>th</sup> September, so children have plenty of time to complete.
