Headteacher's Message



Welcome to this week's newsletter.

I can't quite believe that we are very nearly at the end of the term.

Weather

We have all worked very hard this week and keeping all the children as cool and safe as we can, that said with classrooms full of bodies it has been a challenge and we are all grateful it is the weekend. As you know we have considered more extreme mitigations for next week to manage the extreme weather. Every time I look at the forecast the temperature rises with it set to being 37 and 38 degrees on Monday and Tuesday. Considering all the health and safety laws and the keeping children safe in hot weather guidance I have decided that the best thing to do is to start school at 08:30am and close at 11:30am avoiding the hottest part of the day.

I would also recommend that children under the age of 4 remain at home as they are more at risk of heat stress than older children, please read the guidance: <u>looking after children and those in early years settings during heatwaves</u>,

I will keep an eye on the forecast and if it looks at all like the weather will drop, we will have a full day as normal. I will communicate any change to the plan.

As it stands, Monday and Tuesday look set to be very hot so it may be that we have the 08:30 – 11:30 timings for both days, but I will keep an eye on the forecast and keep you informed if the temperature looks to drop.

Year 6 have their leavers assembly and street party planned for Tuesday; I will email all Year 6 parents to let you know how we plan to accommodate these events as we would still very much like them to go ahead, however we may need to modify them slightly.

Calendar

SLT have started to update the school calendar for the Autumn term and it now links, finally, with the school website. Please see the school calendar for more information on upcoming events. Any changes due to the weather on Monday and Tuesday will be communicated to you directly, we may not have the opportunity to change the calendar.

Gates

Gates open at 08:25am. I know that for some time they were being opened earlier than this, however, I had not directed this, and we had a few issues with unsupervised children being on the school site. Staff are not available to monitor the playgrounds until 08:30am. Therefore, we cannot open the gates any earlier than 08:25. I know some of you are concerned about queues forming, however if people do not arrive too early, these queues should not build up. Please do not send your children or bring them to school before 08:25am. This is ample time to get into class, I have checked with class teachers in Year 5 and 6 and there have been no issues with children being late because we open the gates at 08:25. There are other reasons, but the gate opening times are not one of them.

Fayre – Year 6 are organizing a school fayre for KS2 to enjoy during the afternoon, and we will open it up to KS1 and family's afterschool.

Guard of honor – Please make sure everyone is outside to send off our lovely Year 6 pupils by 11:55 at the latest, the year 6 team will then bring them out to the field and walk around the Priory Mile.

End of year briefing – If it is nice, we will gather on the field to do a final end of year briefing before you can go if not, we will do it in the hall. I can confirm that we will hold the final briefing at





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1:45pm to give everyone time to tidy and sort classes/ fridges/ cupboards. Please make sure the site is as tidy as it can be to allow the site team and cleaners clear access.

INSET days: School opens for INSETs on the 1st and 2nd September for staff only. School starts for Years 1 – 6 on the 5th September. We have sent separate details to parents of children in Early years and Orchard as we will be transitioning children back into school the week of the 5th September.

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Apocalyptic Day for Year 5

Year 5 took part in an extraordinary 'apocalyptic world' experience as part of a new initiative called 'immersive learning. Guided by the learning mentors, a group of selected pupils planned and delivered activities for their peers throughout the day. These took place in a specially designed setting and included working as a team to provide survival kits and clean water for their tribes, and deciding how best to support the weaker tribes.















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We took a group of children from year 5 to help them gain a deeper understanding of their curriculum.

We wanted the children to develop a curriculum lesson, led and designed by them, which they thought other children would enjoy.

They planned and designed a day of immersive activities based on the scenario of ' Climate Change'.

The children decided that they would explore what would happen if things went wrong and they would have to survive a climate apocalypse.


They split the other year 5's into different tribes or factions and taught survival skills.

They designed a whole staged room from scratch over a period of months.

They designed water filtration systems, Oxygen tanks and made rudimentary soap from lard and ash.

The children then had to barter for resources and decide if they would share or keep the resources with the other teams.

Exploring how divided our world can be currently, when it comes to resources, and how climate change can impact on quality of life.
