Our Learning

English

This week in class, we have started our new book 'The Queen's hat'. We created and decorated our own special hat and looked at the effects of a windy day by using a hair dryer to blow them off our heads. Also, we looked at the key vocabulary in the story and answered comprehension questions about the books.

Next week, we will be sequencing the story and using adjectives to describe the Queen.

This week, we have been looking at parts and wholes. We have been using different maths manipulatives, such as counters, to recognise a whole and sharing them into two different parts. Next week, we will look at part-whole models.

Miss Hall's maths.

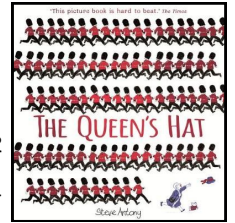
This week, Miss Hall's maths group have been adding tens using a number line. Next week, we will begin by adding teen numbers using number line and move onto two 2-digit numbers.

Afternoons.

This week, we have been learning about the country of Wales. We have sorted the human and physical features such as Cardiff Castle and Mount Snowden and made our own weaving patterns inspired by traditional Welsh blankets.

For Science, we recapped the main parts of the human body by drawing round ourselves and adding labels to the different parts.
