

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English

This week the children have enjoyed using drama to explore the story 'Stone Age Boy'. They have written some super sentences using a variety of adverbials as well as precise verbs and onomatopoeia. The teachers have been very impressed by the exciting vocabulary that the children have used.

Maths

This week, the children have explored the world of numbers. They have been involved in solving questions that involve hundreds, place value charts, writing numbers in words, partitioning numbers up to 1,000 and flexibly partitioning numbers below and above 50.

<u>History</u>

This week the children started to learn about early homes. They have been fascinated as to how early man lived in caves and were impressed how they lived at the entrance to the cave for light and warmth.
