Personal, Social & Emotional Development

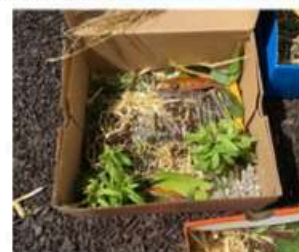

Our Learning

This week in English, the children are working really hard this week editing their whale stories and sharing them with each other. The children have also then been looking at different holiday catalogues and thinking about what persuades someone to choose a certain holiday.

In Maths, the children have been looking at money. They have been thinking about how to convert between pounds and pence. Also, comparing different amounts of money.

Next week, in English, the children are going to be looking at the features of a persuasive text and what tools the writer uses to persuade the reader.

In Maths, we are going to be moving on to look at time and the children are going to be looking at converting between 24 hour and 12 hour clock. Also, looking at the difference between analogue and digital clocks.

Our Learning

This week, we started our science unit on plants and animals. Here we explored the differences and similarities between the animal and plant kingdoms.

In maths, we focussed on practical lessons connected to metric and imperial units. We have also completed our final assessments for the year!

In English, we started our new topic, power of reading with a focus on a new book called "Street Child". We also complete our final SPAG and reading assessments which should come home today.

Next week, we will continue our science unit with an eco-friendly eye: we will learn about life cycles and then explore the importance of bees. We will also learn about scientists that dedicate their lives to conservation.

In maths, we will begin looking at time. We will be focusing on the theoretical and practical side of telling the time using a digital clock and analogue.

In English, we will continue to read "Street Child", and will be delving deep into the text and connecting with the characters through targeted tasks.

We visited Burnham Grammar School for a primary liaison day. We took part in Maths, English, Science, Geography and PE. We felt like secondary school children!



PSHRE Focus: In PSHRE this term, we are on our last JIGSAW unit 'Changing Me' where we will learn about self-image, puberty and coping positively with change. Towards the end of the unit, we will start preparing ourselves for the year ahead by focussing on building healthy relationships and learning the skills required to develop resilience, assertiveness and self-respect.

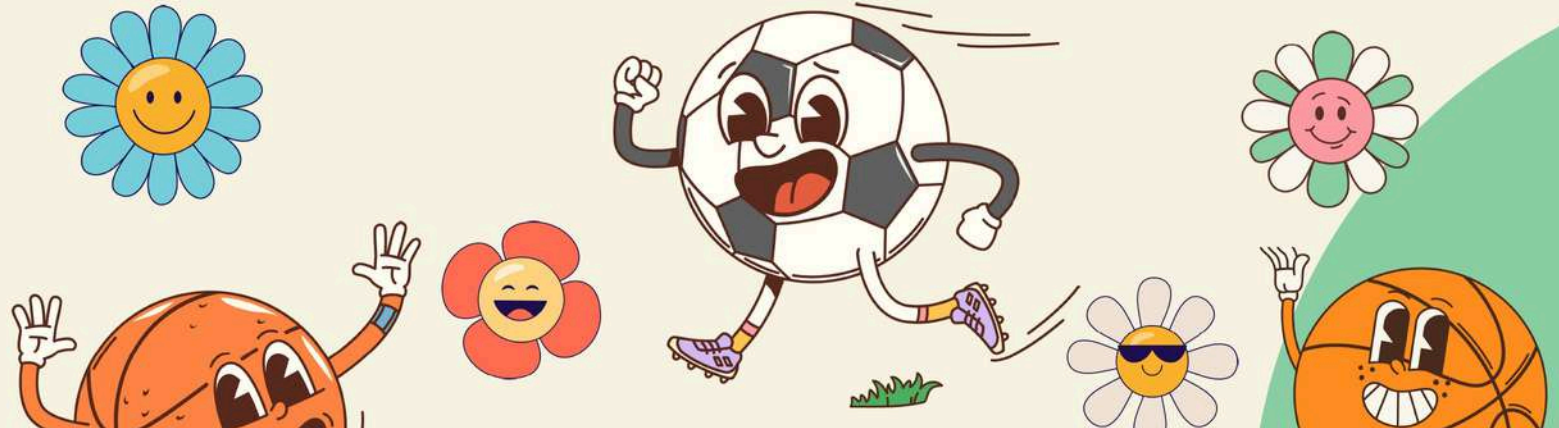

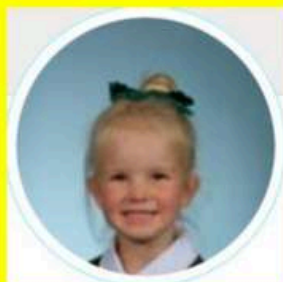

Summer water safety

Accidents are mostly preventable with the correct knowledge and judgment and here are our tips to staying safe in the water during the summer:

To enjoy the water safely and make the right call...

- **Enter slowly and carefully**
Think carefully about your ability to splash or swim in cold outdoor water. 49% of those who lost their life were classified as swimmers*. Are you really a good swimmer?
- **Stay within reach**
Don't go too far and stay within a standing depth.
- **Always be supervised**
Over 70% of fatal accidents occur in the absence of professional supervision. Seek life guarded areas and always make sure some one is available to raise the alarm.

Summer is an amazing time to enjoy our beautiful waterways but we must be mindful that warmer weather is directly linked to an increase in fatal drowning incidents.

Rivers and Lakes/Lochs pose the greatest statistical risk as there are often hazards that the average person is equipped to handle and there is a lack of professional supervision.

In an emergency...

- **Call 999**
If you are at the coast, call 999 and ask for the Coastguard. Don't enter the water to rescue.
- **If you're in trouble FLOAT and call for help**
Fall in or become tired – stay calm, float on your back and call for help. Throw something that floats to somebody that has fallen in.

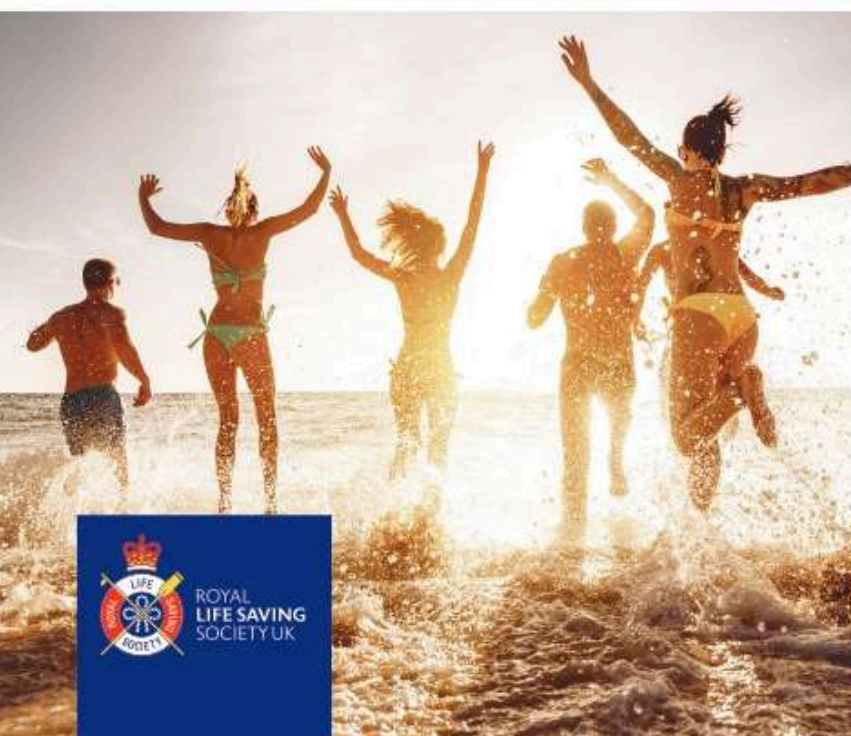
