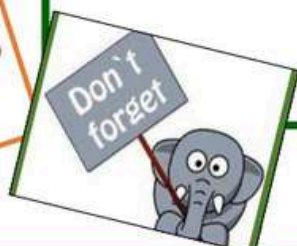
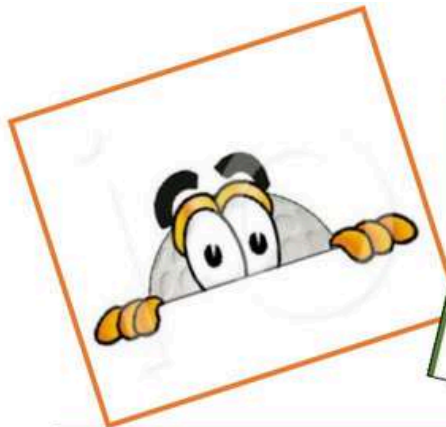

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

Our Learning - This week:



Communication and Language Development:

We have started a new phonics phase this week and have been learning the sounds: **oo, oo, ar, or**. Please take some time to review these sounds at home with your child. Continuing to read together regularly makes a big difference—thank you for your support! The children are beginning to apply their phonics skills in Drawing Club, where they are creating “magic codes” to bring their pictures to life. This week, we have been exploring the story *Little Red Riding Hood*.

The children are beginning to apply their phonics skills during Drawing Club, where they create “magic codes” to bring their pictures to life. This week, we explored the story *Rainbow Serpent*, using our imagination and creativity to illustrate different parts of the story. We have also started Literacy as a continuation of our Drawing Club learning. This week we have been learning the story *Little Red and the Very Hungry Lion*. The children have been practising their early writing skills by labelling the characters from the story.

Please also practise the following tricky words at home: **the, of, I, put, pull, full, was, they, you, push**. Becoming confident with these words will greatly support your child’s reading progress.

Maths:

In Reception, we have been learning about the concept of time. The children have been exploring day and night and discussing the different activities we do at these times. We have been practicing using time words such as today, tomorrow, yesterday, next and later. The children have also been sequencing events from their daily routines, such as getting ready for school and bedtime. These activities help them understand how events happen in order throughout the day and week. Please continue to practice numbers at home to help build your child's confidence and fluency

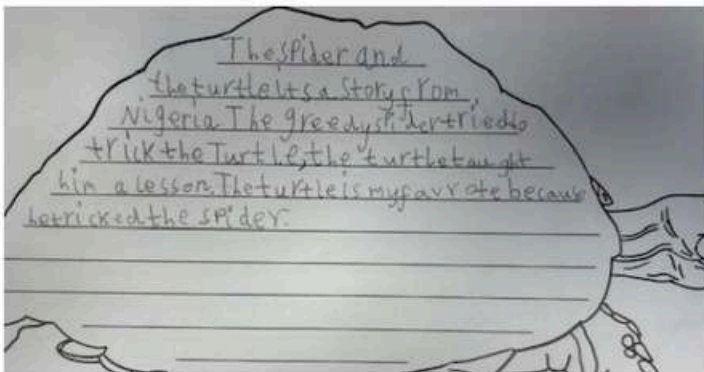

In Maths this week we have continued to learn about number bonds to 20. We looked for patterns by listing all the number bonds we could recall and discussed what we noticed.

For World Book Day, we looked at traditional tales from the continent of Africa. In Year 1 we read "The Spider and the Turtle" a folk story from Nigeria. A trickster spider is reluctant to share his food, so devises a plan to cheat Turtle out of her share. Turtle however decides to teach Spider a lesson!

We then explored traditional Tingatinga art from Zimbabwe. We really liked this bright, vibrant, patterned artwork! Each class then listened to a story from Tinga Tinga Tales - like Why the Giraffe has a Long Neck. In the afternoon, we created our own paintings inspired by Tingatinga art.

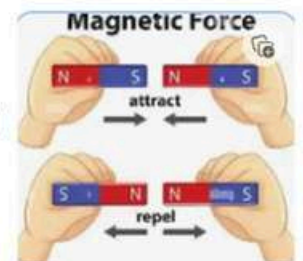

This week, in History we looked at the spread of Islam and focused on Baghdad,



Our Learning

This week, we continued exploring the Islamic Empire where we looked at Baghdad and the spread of Islam.

In maths, we continued to learn new strategies across percentages, linking them to: fractions, decimals, rectilinear shapes.

In English, we researched our chosen topic and wrote our own persuasive pitch focusing on either walking to school, fast fashion or planting trees in public spaces.

This term in PSHRE, we began our 'Healthy Me' topic and looked at making healthy choices as we grow older.

Next week, we will begin our art unit which focus on pattern making, photography and mix media artworks. We will learn about tessellation; Islamic geometric and vegetal artworks; Lalla Essaydi's photography; calligraphy; and Yayoi Kusama's installation pieces.

In maths, we will complete our assessments in arithmetic and Reasoning.

In English, we will complete Spelling, Punctuation and Grammar Assessments and a Reading Assessment. This will support the children to develop their test stamina and build up their confidence for the SATs next year.
