

Our Learning

This week:

In math this week, we finished our unit on place value within 50. The children spent time practicing finding one more and one less of a number using different math resources. We also introduced the children to counting in 10's.

In English this week, we recapped all of the speedy sounds and tricky words we have learnt this term. The children have become really efficient in remember the different sounds for each grapheme and are becoming more confident in reading words with split digraphs.

In afternoon sessions this week, we spent time making Easter cards during our DT unit. The children learnt how to use a split pin and lever to make an element of their card move. They really enjoyed decorating their cards with lots of sparkly sequins, feathers and stickers! On Thursday, we then spent time evaluating the Easter cards and we wrote sentences about what we liked, disliked and what we would improve next time.





Our Learning

This week in English, the children have been really enjoying reading the class reader, 'The child at the back of the class' and they have been practising writing in a formal style to write a letter to the government.

In Maths, we have continued to learn about the concept of mixed numbers and improper fractions which the children have found challenging. We are using diagrams to help the children understand the concept.

After the holidays in English, the children are going to be looking at Norse Mythology. At first, we will be looking at Arthur and the Golden Rope. The children will be creating a role on the wall and we will be focusing on the grammar objectives for Year 4.

In Maths, the children are going to be continuing to look at fractions and we will be focusing on adding and subtracting fractions.

In the afternoons in geography, we will continue to think about oceans and seas. Our focus will be on features of a sea bed and then we will study Ocean Pollution and how we can stop the detrimental impact it has on the environment.

Our Learning

This week, in DT, we started our new topic on bridges! We explored bridges around the world (including some that move!) and looked at how the different parts of a bridge work together to keep it stable.

In English, we extended the narrative of the story by writing our own fiction piece. We then continued to read The Last Wild as a class reader.

In maths, we focussed on the last few topics on reflection, statistics and scaling.

Next week, in **DT**, we will continue learning about the different parts of bridges. Then we will design and build our own bridges, combining the skills that we have learnt.

In English, we will be focussing on Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation revision in preparation for the SATs.

In maths, we will be focussing on maths revision in preparation for the SATs.

PSHRE Focus: Healthy Me. In PSHRE this term, we will learn how to take responsibility for our wellbeing. We will know about different types of drugs and how they affect the human body — particularly the liver and the heart. 

Curling Trip Summary for Year 5 Students

This week our Year 5 children had the exciting opportunity to try curling! Curling is a fun and unique sport played, where teams take turns sliding large stones towards a target. Here's a quick summary of what we did and learned:

- 1. Introduction to Curling: We started with a short lesson to learn the basics of curling. Our instructor explained how the game works, the rules, and the equipment. We learned that curling stones are made of granite and that the goal is to slide them as close as possible to a target.
- 2. Learning the Techniques: We practiced sliding the stones along the floor, trying to make them stop near the target. Some of us also tried sweeping, which is when players use brushes to help guide the stone's path. It was harder than it looked!

- 5. Wrap-Up: At the end of the trip, we gathered to talk about what we enjoyed most. Many of us said we liked how much fun it was to try something new and work as a team. We also learned about sportsmanship and the importance of patience and practice.

Overall, our curling trip was a fantastic experience and the Priory School team came 4th place out of 11 schools, we are very proud to have accomplished 4th place and the children's sportsmanship throughout the tournament was amazing. It gave us a chance to try a new sport, learn about teamwork, and most importantly, have fun!
